St Monans Village FIFE

St Monans is one of the chain of pretty fishing villages that line the north shore of the Firth of Forth, in what is known as the East Neuk of Fife. Lying between Elie and Pittenweem, the village offers an extensive historical core running behind the harbour, backed by newer development as you move inland. A village called Inverie existed here as far back as the 800s. In about 875, St Monanus – or St Monan – was buried at a shrine here and the village was renamed St Monans.

Kinloch Rannoch PERTH & KINROSS,

Sitting on the banks of the River Tummel, lying at the east end of Loch Rannoch, is Kinloch Rannoch. This fairly remote village, with its small population, is very popular with tourists seeking outdoor adventures in stunning scenery. The Rannoch Moor nearby, dotted with little lochs, islets and sandy bays, offers fantastic trails for ramblers. Like many parts of the Highlands, its history is bloody. During the Battle of Culloden, the final fight between the Jacobites and the British Government in 1745, nearly 2,000 Scots were killed or wounded.

Skara Brae ORKNEY ISLANDS

This Neolithic Age site, consisting of 10 stone structures, is near the Bay of Skail, Orkney Islands. Today, the village is situated by the shore, but when it was inhabited (c.3100-2500BCE) it would have been further inland. Traditionally, Skara Brae is said to have been discovered in 1850CE when an enormous storm struck Orkney, and dispersed the sand and soil that had buried the site. The landowner, William Watt, noticed the exposed stone walls and began excavations, uncovering four stone houses.

Neist Point Lighthouse ISLE OF SKYE

One of the most famous lighthouses in Scotland, it is situated on the most westerly tip of Skye near Glendale. Neist Point lighthouse was engineered by David A. Stevenson and the light was first lit on 1 November 1909. The fog signal, which has since been discontinued, was completed on 25 June 1910. The station was converted to automatic operation in 1990. The point is regarded as the best place on Skye to see whales, dolphins, porpoises and basking sharks. The sea around the point is teeming with seabirds including gannets, black guillemots, razorbills and shags.

Plockton

LOCH CARRON, HIGHLANDS

Overlooking Loch Carron, it is often referred to as the 'Jewel of the Highlands', and offers breathtaking scenery and landscapes, secluded bays, coral beaches, islands, and panoramic views. Because of its spectacular setting and traditional Highland atmosphere, Plockton has appeared in numerous film and television productions, the most well-known being the BBC's 'Hamish Macbeth' series. Thomas Telford, a world famous civil engineer, canal and road builder, was responsible for the design of Plockton Parish Church.

Neidpath Castle PEEBLES, BORDERS

The castle sits in a commanding position above the River Tweed. It is an unspoilt 14th-century Keep, last modernised in the 1600s. Equipped with a dungeon, well, long-drops and fireplaces large enough to roast an ox, there are also a set of exquisite 20th-century batiks – telling the story of Mary Queen of Scots, who stayed there. The true beauty of Neidpath is that very little has changed over the years. The rugged stone walls, hidden staircases and beautiful views from the battlements would all be very familiar to its former residents.

River Clyde GLASGOW

Reflected in the River Clyde, the spectacular Clyde Arc opened in 2006, a combined road and pedestrian bridge. The Clyde Waterfront regeneration changed the waterfront skyline with striking effect with bold architecture including the Glasgow Science Centre, IMAX Cinema, Glasgow Tower and the SECC. Glasgow's wealth grew in the 19th century from heavy industry and shipbuilding on the River Clyde. The city also became a hub of ideas, with artists, designers and architects creating attractive and radical new buildings.

Loch Lomond STIRLING

Situated in southern Scotland, the surrounding highlands area is home to red deer and oak woodlands. On the eastern shore, footpaths and cycle trails criss-cross the craggy Ben Lomond mountain and the smaller Conic Hill. Across the loch, Luss Heritage Path winds through rolling countryside and the ancient Luss village, with its stone cottages. The Loch Lomond & The Trossachs National Park became fully operational on 19 July 2002 and was officially opened by Princess Anne on 24 July 2002.

Ardvreck Castle LOCH ASSYNT, HIGHLANDS

A marvellously scenic ruined fortress in a magnificent location under the brooding bulk of Quinag, Ardvreck Castle (Aird Bhreac in Gaelic) is a 15th–16th-century L-plan fortified tower house and the traditional seat of the MacLeods of Assynt. The castle was constructed by Angus Mor III in the late 15th century. The site chosen for the castle was an easily defensible one on a small promontory of land jutting out into Loch Assynt. Today, the promontory is sometimes cut off by high water, leaving Ardvreck on an island.
